THE STEINWAY HALL EXPERIENCE

On Friday 20th January, Daniel King and I were taken to Steinway Hall in London with Mr Sizer and Daniel's mother.

There were many grand pianos and baby grands. I was awe struck.

We then went to the masterclass session. Steinway had called in Charles Owen, one of Britain's greatest pianists to come and listen to each pianist and give them tips on how to improve their playing.

6 pupils from 3 different schools had been selected for this opportunity. We had 10 minutes to practise with a baby grand before we were called onto stage to play the full size concert grand. Surya was on first playing a Haydn Sonata.

This was a really useful session and good quality time was spent. I had learnt that there were so many fine details to add to my piece just to make it that much better!

After the ordeal but yet fascinating master class, Charles said his goodbyes and we went on a phenomenal tour around the hall with a man called George Soole. He explained how there were only 2 places in the world that made Steinway pianos - New York and Hamburg. A Steinway grand piano is hand-crafted and takes 12 months to make - 3 years if you include the two years it takes to dry and season the wood. We met a technician who works on pianos that people like Lang Lang or Vladimir Ashkenazy play when in London. Lang Lang is currently one of the most famous pianists on the planet and has performed at many important events.

Then we saw the action of the piano being taken out. The mechanics are very complicated with over 12000 parts – much more than a formula one car! Then Surya was invited to play a piano that had been rebuilt after 100 years.

After seeing all the pianos being worked on we went back up to the shop to see the new ones: some plain, everyday black pianos, a dreadful white one and even one black one that was coated with real gold leaf and carvings!!!

Apart from the session with Charles Owen, the best part of the trip for me was seeing a piano which played by itself. It was controlled by an ipad and real recordings from famous performers were played by the piano!

This special piano called the Steinway Spirio piano starts at around £80,000. Incredible!

The Steinway master class experience was one that I will never forget and I have learnt a lot from it.

Special thanks to Mr Sizer and the staff that enabled this wonderful trip to take place.
