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

More Good News. We finally have all the internal plans of both the Pavilion and Bungalow buildings for the South Croydon site, ready for the rebuild which starts in a few months' time.


Mrs Saul is now teaching music again and I would to say a big thank you to her for stepping in over the last few months to help out.
