Each boy who took part was awarded with a small prize to reward their efforts, and we have displayed the wonderful posters around the school.

The Reception staff are always looking for ways to support our boys to be prepared for the transition to Year 1. Therefore, as of Tuesday, 7th February, we will be trialling a new way of lining up in the morning. On the first bell the boys will stand still as usual and at this point I would like you to wave a quiet farewell to your son and to promptly leave the playground. Once the playground is empty of parents, a second bell will be rung and the boys will line up. If you need to speak urgently to your sons class teacher, please speak to the teacher on duty. Most usually a message can be written in the contact book and your sons teacher will arrange to see you later that day between 3.00pm and 3.15pm.

I would like to remind you that between 8.00am—8.15am you have the option to pass your son over to the care of the teacher on duty in the playground. If you choose to stay with him in the playground, you remain responsible for his conduct until school starts at 8.15am. Please ensure that his behaviour does not have an adverse impact on any of the other children and that he obeys our school rules.

This also applies at the end of the day, during Football Club and Book View. Thank you for your continued support which is much appreciated by all of the Reception staff.
