The 'Grand Music Day' at Reigate Grammar

On Monday 26th June, 17 girls from Cumnor House School were taken to Reigate Grammar school for a 'Grand Music Day'.

This involved about 80 children from different local primary/prep schools (both boys and girls) joining together for a day of choral, orchestral and ensemble tuition and performance.

Judging by the look on the girls' faces, they had a wonderful time, although they certainly had to work hard. The orchestral musicians had been sent their music and Jessica Dolby was chosen to lead the orchestra with Eloane Regy leading the cellos, which was a wonderful reflection on the abilities of our girls as well as the training Mrs Murray gives week by week in the school orchestra.

The afternoon started dramatically with the whole orchestra joining in as a Samba band and marching round the church performing, what turned out to be a well-rehearsed and prepared performance.

Then the orchestra performed the 'Hall of the Mountain King' from Grieg's 'Peer Gynt suite' followed by the 'March' from Raiders of the lost ark, both played with a lot of gusto (and a lot of percussion!)

After this, the choir sang a couple of songs (from memory) one in an African dialect with plenty of canonic singing, and the other about good health and well-being, all of this learnt just that morning.

To finish off the afternoon, the choir joined the orchestra and they performed another African song in a piece that none of the children had ever seen before. This time with wonderfully energetic actions.

I spoke to the Head of Music at Reigate Mr Carden afterwards and he was highly complimentary about the girls.

I then spoke to the choral conductor, Ms Amy Bebbington and she told me that as soon as she saw the girls in their red blazers, she had recognised

them, as she had been an adjudicator at the Leith Hill Music Festival 18 months ago when the Chamber choir had performed (and won). She even remembered what we sang and said how impressed she was with the complexity of the songs we had done! Today she said the Cumnor girls were extremely confident and again was very complimentary about their training. Finally I spoke to the string coach, Mt Adrian Charlesworth, who was totally effusive about the ability of our girls, thanking Mrs Murray for helping the string girls prepare for the day. I left the venue feeling a glow of pride not just in the ability and behaviour of the girls, but also in the fact that our music department at Cumnor Girls had been given such encouragement by three people whom we had never met before.
