


Thank you to the parents' association for their work for the Macmillian Coffee morning today. I was pleased that we could support such a good cause.





Boys Swimming News

A team of 18 boys travelled to Kings College School Wimbledon on Monday 25th September to compete in a triangular swimming gala against KCS and Garden House School.

The gala was held in a 30 metre pool which was quite a jump for our swimmers who are used to swimming in a 17 meter pool.

Our swimmers rose to the challenge and put in a very impressive display of swimming, winning the gala with 86 points with Garden House runners up with 76 points and KCS third with 56 points.

We won 10 of the 15 individual races and 5 of the 9 relay races. Individual winners were Jeremiah Carnegie, William Letchford, Thevan Iyavoo, Laurence Qin, Rhys Waltham, Shivendra Prashad, Joshua Karpal, Ethan Spoerer-Scott, Noah Dominguez-Tchetche and Alexander Sadotti.

For all of the girls involved they worked exceptionally hard with true dedication and determination to the very end.




