

Thank you for visiting us Mrs Mallett.








Ancient Egypt Week.

King Tutankhamun

What are we learning today?

In ICT and History this week, the class have been using the iPads to research facts about King Tutankhamun. We then shared our group facts with the rest of the class and designed an interesting and informative poster about this incredible pharaoh.

Each group researched a different topic about Tutankhamun and fed back to our peers. Here you can see us using the iPads to find out about him.











Tutankhamun is without doubt the most famous pharaoh today. Tutankhamun's tomb was discovered by the British archaeologist Howard Carter on the 4th of November 1922, nearly 3000 years after his death. King Tutankhamun was buried in The Valley of the Kings. King Tutankhamun's tomb was the first untouched tomb to be discovered. Never before had a tomb been found with the pharaoh and all of his treasures still inside.

King Tut was born in a place called Akhetaten. Akhetaten was the capital city of Egypt at the time. He was born in 1346 BC.

King Tutankhamun became pharaoh when he was just nine years old! He was nicknamed the Boy King because he was so young. He only reigned for about 9



Tutankhamun is very well known today because his tomb was discovered less than 100 years ago and it was still intact. Most Egyptian tombs had been raided by robbers!

The Boy King died when he was just 18 years old. Some people believe he was killed but others think he died from a broken leg.


