

GUIDELINES FOR PUPIL USE OF COMPUTERS, THE INTERNET & E-MAIL FACILITIES

Pupils using the School Network must do so responsibly and for constructive purposes. If in doubt, they should always ask one of their teachers.

The following are not permitted:

- Attempting to access sites which have been blocked by the School
- Using the system for purposes other than direct school curriculum use
- Attempting to or actually accessing the folders, files or work of other pupils
- Sending or displaying offensive messages or pictures
- Damaging computers, computer systems, computer networks either physically or within software
- Violating copyright laws
- Attempting to or using others' passwords
- Intentionally wasting consumable resources e.g. paper or ink/toner
- Disobeying any teachers' instructions regarding the usage of the system whether supervised or unsupervised which is not explicitly referred to above
