## The Cumnor 13+ Award

The 'Cumnor 13+ Award' has been developed as an exciting and creative curriculum and assessment procedure aimed at promoting greater independence and recognising the all-round ability of our pupils. This award will embrace the best of the ISEB syllabus and combine this with the very best practice from development programmes such as the Duke of Edinburgh Scheme to allow children to develop more holistically, in line with Cumnor House School's stated aims.

The new 13+ Award will look more holistically at how we can promote and celebrate 'independent, lifelong learning'. As such, it is sub-divided into sections to embrace this and allow pupils to develop their skills in all areas of school life.

# Qualifying Criteria

# Academic

This award is given to those pupils who attain a number of 'A' grades in Common Entrance subjects. The Academic Award has a double weighting towards the pupils overall certification grading.

## **Gold**

Gold award achieved for 65% or more in 6 or more CE subjects

## **Silver**

Silver award achieved for 65% or more in 4 or more CE subjects

## **Bronze**

Bronze award achieved for 65% or more in 2 or more CE subjects

## **Pass**

Pass achieved for 50% in 6 or more CE subjects





This award is given to those pupils who have achieved at the highest level across a range of sports at Cumnor House School. Whilst performance in various activities is valued, a pupil's commitment is also considered and will contribute to the overall award. These include, at different levels, the pupils effort, attitude, and participation. This is a system which is accessible for each pupil. They are able to achieve this award with a positive approach to taking part balanced with a reasonably strong level of performance. 

# After Examination Commitment



At Speech Day, each pupil will be awarded their certificate, similar to a graduation. The certificate will include an overall grading and will indicate the achievement for each aspect. The overall grade will be dependent on where the pupil falls into the following points categories:

**Gold Award: 28+ points**

**Silver Award: 20-27 points**

**Bronze Award: 14-19 points**

**Pass Award: 8- 13 points**

Pupils will meet with Form Tutor once every half term to monitor progress and discuss targeted award

Head of Upper School to meet pupils on a termly basis to discuss the attainment of criteria

Pupils in Year 7 will begin to take part in this initiative with some aspects able to be carried over for Year 8 criteria

Year 7 pupils will meet with Head of Upper School at the end of Year 7 to review the year and set realistic targets for Year 8

Additions to the curriculum will take place in order to provide pupils with opportunity to express each aspect (Music Day, Young Enterprise and Dragons Den)

An information booklet will be available to all parents and pupils at the information evening at the beginning of next term. All pupils will be informed and aware of each aspect and the criteria
