Reception Classes – Information for Parents

Mathematics

One number a week from 0 to 5 and count, recognise, order and write numbers.
Make number sets and compare quantities.
Use vocabulary involved in adding and subtracting.
Add 1 more and 2 more to numbers within 5.
Recognise 1p, 2p and 5p coins and their values.
Find numbers 1-5 on the clock and recognise o'clock times.
Name and identify the properties of 2D and 3D shapes.
Recognise and recreate simple shapes and patterns.



Literacy

Learn to recognise and write single sounds.
Blend sounds to read and write simple words.
Listen and respond to stories and rhymes.
Re-tell Nursery Rhymes, Traditional Tales and Stories.
Write labels, notices and shopping lists in the mark making and role play areas.
Rhyming and rhythmic activities.
Alliterative activities.
Pencil control and letter formation practice.
Comprehension discussions within story time.



Topic – This is Me

Discuss families and the similarities and differences.
Understand that everyone is different, but everyone is special.
Discuss our Chatterboxes and talk confidently about our holidays and home life.
Look at our own bodies and facial features.
Learn about our new school environment and the staff who help us and keep us safe.

Swimming

Understand pool rules and boundaries.
Water confidence games, building aquatic breathing and submerging
Travelling on noodle and floats / unaided or front and back

PE

Familiarisation with P.E apparatus, equipment and areas.
General Body Awareness and Co-ordination.
Use of large balls, sending and receiving.

Ways in which you can help your daughter this half-term:

- ✓ Practice reading and writing the letter sounds taught in class.
- ✓ Share well known Nursery Rhymes and simple repetitive stories.
- ✓ Encourage her to express herself orally.
- ✓ Practice counting groups of 5 or more objects, touching each object as it is counted.
- ✓ Help her to recognise numbers from 0 – 5 and forming them correctly.
- ✓ Encourage them to dress and undress independently.
- ✓ Check the Seesaw app daily.
