<p>English</p>	<p>Text/Stimulus: The First Drawing by Mordicai Gerstein Outcomes: Character descriptions, diary entry, recount, narrative Skills: Apply knowledge of root words – Use prefixes and suffixes – Spell further homophones</p>
<p>Maths</p>	<p>Place Value Identify, represent and estimate numbers using different representations. Find 10 or 100 more or less than a given number. Recognise the place value of each digit in a three-digit number (hundreds, tens, ones). Compare and order numbers up to 1000 Read and write numbers up to 1000 in numerals and in words. Solve number problems and practical problems involving these ideas. Count from 0 in multiples of 4, 8, 50 and 100 Addition and Subtraction Add and subtract numbers with up to three digits, using formal written methods of columnar addition and subtraction. Estimate the answer to a calculation and use inverse operations to check answers. Solve problems, including missing number problems, using number facts, place value, and more complex addition and subtraction.</p>
<p>Science</p>	<p>Plants Set up reliable and accurate investigations. Make and explain predictions. Make and record accurate observations. Use scientific language to explain their findings. Explain the functions of the different parts of a flower. Be able to ask and answer questions based on their learning using scientific language.</p>
<p>Drama</p>	<p>Core physical movement skills Emotions – using facial expression and body language</p>
<p>Spanish</p>	<p>Introductions Greetings and feelings Alphabet Numbers 1-40 Colours All about me</p>
<p>Food Tech</p>	<p>Fruit and Vegetables Understanding the use of kitchen equipment. Kitchen safety and how to prepare to cook and clean safely. Skills: Peeling, cutting, squeezing, analysing food tasting with good sensory verbs, cleaning, drying and tidying.</p>
<p>Humanities</p>	<p>Geography – South America Locate the UK and South America on a world map. Know some geographical facts about South America. Identify geographical and human features of South America.</p>

Computing	<p>Word processing skills - touch typing</p> <p>Online safety: Cyberbullying, Keep it to yourself, Emailing, Online communication</p>
Art	<p>Drawing from memory, imagination and observation. Observational drawing and painting of fruit and vegetables with the theme of Harvest in mind. Development and participation in a Key Stage 2 group work during Black History Month to produce a large, collaborative work of art.</p>
Music	<p>Using voices expressively through singing rounds. Playing tuned/un-tuned instruments to B.Britten's Young Persons Guide to the orchestra theme. Listening and recognising instruments from each section of a symphony orchestra. Singing harvest songs.</p>
PE	<p>Games – Netball Review court markings. Develop an understanding of basic netball rules. Develop netball specific hand eye co-ordination by focusing on ball handling. Increased understanding and development of 'footwork'. Attacking - Using space to retain possession.</p> <p>P.E – Fitness through game-based play Understanding how to keep the body fit and healthy. Playing a variety of games which focus on various fitness components e.g. balance, co-ordination.</p> <p>Swimming Ensure all Year 2 learning goals are consolidated. Reinforce the importance of lane etiquette. Continue to develop good technique across the 4 strokes.</p>
