


Team work - who can build the tallest tower





This half term has been a busy one in the Music Department, and next half term looks even busier! The first stage of the **House Music Competition** is complete, and the finalist lists for each final have been posted around the school and will be sent out separately on Cognita Connect. Congratulations to all boys who have taken part - it has been lovely to see how enthusiastically they have performed and how thoughtful their classmates have been in their feedback. The finals are taking place on Wednesday 2nd March (Bronze) and Friday 4th March (Silver/Gold) and I am very excited to announce that we have the Director of Music from The Cedars School coming to judge the Silver and Gold finals. In the same week, some boys are taking part in an **orchestral day** at Woldingham School with the London Mozart Players, and the **Little Voices Choir** are singing at the Coulsdon & Purley Music Festival - two fantastic experiences for the boys. There is also an **informal concert** coming up on Thursday 17th March for those boys taking AB exams this term and we will be inviting some of the certificate holders from the House Music Finals to perform as well. This week the **Year 3** boys are very excited that they are being allowed to take home their **Music Scheme** instruments. *Please can I ask that if there are any issues or problems with instruments (strings/valves/keys/reeds/etc!) during half term, that you drop me an email* - more often than not it is something I can fix easily which saves time (and money!) in the long run. If it is helpful for those boys with larger instruments, they can bring them to school on a Monday to save them carrying them along with their sports bags.

The individual instrumental teachers are busy writing **half yearly reports** for all the boys they teach, and these will be coming home in named envelopes in the week after half term, so please check your sons' bag if he has not handed it to you by the Friday!

Finally, we are reaching the final stages of rehearsals towards our production of **Joseph**. If your son is involved in anyway, it is vital that he now attends every rehearsal he is asked to (unless off school ill) as well as learning his words/music and using the rehearsal tracks on Teams. A rehearsal schedule will be on Teams and on the music noticeboards in school, but there may be extra rehearsals for soloists/groups during break times. Mrs Trice has said there will be 5 House points given to any boy who is "script down" after half term!

Dear Parents

Pre-School parents please visit the 'NOTICES' section below for some important details regarding upcoming transition events/information.

Earlier this week we sent a **'Notice'** to parents of **South Croydon Nursery** advising them of a new case of **chickenpox** within the setting. Although chickenpox is a mild disease in normal healthy children, it can be serious in individuals whose immune systems are impaired, are pregnant and have not had chickenpox and young babies. A reminder that children should be kept away from school for at least five days from onset of a rash AND until all spots have completely dried out.

This week at **South Croydon Kindergarten** the children have been reading the book **'The three little pigs'**. The children enjoyed talking about the different houses and the **scary wolf** and enjoyed using the story props to retell the story ad some made up their own versions. There was much excitement when some of the children used the props to build towers and worked hard to see if they could make them balance. This story was then extended into the **role-play** area where the children dressed up in pig and lion costumes and pretended to be the wolf blowing down the pig's houses.

At **Purley Kindergarten** the children have been trying to catch fish from the nursery rhyme **'1,2,3,4,5 once I caught a fish alive'.** They thoroughly enjoyed using a makeshift fishing line with magnets attached to catch the fish, and became very excited when they caught one or two! Also as part of **Mental Health week** the children have been talking about their feelings, looking at the emotion spoons and using an **emotion** wheel to talk about how we are feeling and having great fun pulling angry, sad, happy and funny faces.











This week in our **South Croydon Pre-School,** our story focus was '**Jack and the beanstalk'.** The children have been doing lots of different activities including making their own beanstalks and measuring themselves to see if they are as tall as the giant. In Music, **Miss Secker** taught them a song about Jack and the Giant.



The **Pre-School** children at **Purley** have been focusing on identifying the initial sound in words this week. One group of children were **"building" 3 letter words** with their teacher. They were able to find the initial and final sounds of the words and then decided what the missing middle sound was and build it on the display board. **Great work Pre-School!**









Reception started their week having an assembly about **'Children's Mental Health Week'.** They discussed some of the different **emotions** we experience, and what they should do if they felt they were struggling with an emotion. I was very impressed at how many different people they suggested they could talk to, from their teachers and parents to siblings and grandparents. On Wednesday the Reception boys welcomed back **Mrs Gannon** after her maternity leave. It was lovely to see so many of the **RUS parents** at the virtual coffee morning. Feedback has been that it was a great opportunity to say a proper 'hello' and put a face to the name of Mrs Gannon for many of the parents who have boys attending after school clubs.
