

We have had another **eventful week** at Cumnor and I had a lovely visit from **Alessio, Sebastian and Dhiyaan from 2R** who have been telling me all about their **woodland habitat** topic. They presented some lovely woodland habitats including badgers, foxes and rabbits. Their work is stunning and the **3D background** is very clever. **Well done, boys** - you have worked so hard.







I also had a lovely visit from **Zachary in 2R** who came to show me his very special morning snack. **Zachary's banana skin** had some **sums, questions and lovely messages** on it for him written by mum and dad. What a super idea! Thank you, Zachary.

This week in Reception & Nursery.....

Miss Jama will be leaving us at the end of the month to focus on her family. She has been an **excellent member of staff** and I know you will all **wish her well** with future endeavours. **Mrs Upfold** will begin her **maternity leave** on Monday 24th January and **Mrs Shelley will take on the role of Acting Head of Early Years**. **Mrs Upfold** would like to thank all the parents for their support and their very generous gifts. We wish **Mrs and Mr Upfold** well as they begin this exciting new chapter in their lives

The **Reception boys** have been reading '**Handa's Surprise**' this week as part of our topic '**Stories around the world**.' They have been learning about the **similarities and differences** between **Kenya and England** and have started writing their own version of the story **Handa's Surprise**.

In **Art** the boys have started to make a **djembe drum** and have enjoyed playing the **musical instruments** in class. **Nana and Ayaan** really enjoyed using papier-mâché to cover the outside of their drums.

In **Numeracy** the boys have continued to learn about **two digit numbers to 20** and have been learning how to represent tens and ones using cubes, tens frames and the part-whole method.



This week in the **Purley Kindergarten** the children have been learning about the colour green, number 2 and sound k. Continuing with our 'Nursery Rhyme' theme we have been talking about buses, (wheels on the bus) what colours they are, if they are big or small and who has been on a bus. The children have had a variety a buses to colour and have also been encouraged to draw their own.

They have been decorating **Humpty Dumpty eggs** with faces and thinking about how many eyes, noses and mouths he needs. Kindergarten talked about what happened to Humpty Dumpty when he fell off the wall and broke our own eggs. The children then put them back together using plasters. They really enjoyed re-enacting the nursery rhyme.

In **PE** this week Kindergarten have started to learn how to kick a ball, using little kicks and I was very impressed with their early skills and control when I saw them.

At **South Croydon Kindergarten** have also had a lovely week doing lots of activities based on the '**Nursery Rhymes**' theme. The book they have been reading this week is called 'Doing the animal bop'. This story encouraged the children to think about different animal sounds and move their bodies in different ways.

The children have been practicing drawing **shapes and naming 2D shapes** and developing their fine motor skills. Kindergarten's sound of the week is 'u' and we have been looking at different objects beginning with this sound. They have spent lots of time in the garden and the children have enjoyed using their problem-solving skills on the obstacle course and moving in different ways riding the scooters, running and jumping.

The children have also shown a big interest in caring for babies and to extend this we set up a nappy changing station in the home corner.









This week the **Purley Pre-School class** learnt all about the sound "**p**" in phonics and they focused on **mass, capacity and measurement in maths**.

Their story focus was "**Jack and the Beanstalk**" and there was much excitement as the children helped to trace around Miss Peterson as our giant, to record and compare our heights to. The children have been enjoying taking turns to dramatize the sequence of events from the story of "Jack and the Beanstalk" whilst wearing roleplay masks.

They have also been making **playdough beanstalks** and using the **cube-blocks to measure** how many blocks tall the beanstalks are. The children have thoroughly enjoyed exploring mass with the scales at the messy tray and also writing and drawing pictures about our story focus - the teachers have been encouraging them to label their pictures to draw attention to the importance of writing.

At Forest School the children all planted their own beans to grow into beanstalks (we hope!) which are busy catching sunlight on our classroom windowsill.



In **Pre-School** the children have been reading 'Jack and the Beanstalk' and so at Forest School they planted their own "bean stalks" which they are hoping they can watch grow!



This week in **Willows Pre-School** the children have been learning about 'one less' in maths' by learning the songs 5 currant buns. The children role played buying currant buns from the bakers and then had a go at working out how many were left.

They have also been learning about the continent Africa, linked to the story 'Little Red and the very hungry lion'. They were very lucky to try delicious foods from Uganda and Somalia where Mrs Martin and Miss Jama are from. The children also had lots of fun with Miss Secker making different wintery sounds with percussion instruments and learning lots of football skills with coach Harry.

Woodcote Lane Rules

A reminder please to parents when using Woodcote Lane:

- Please do drive carefully being considerate of the neighbours
- Please drive at 15mph or below
- Please do not do any U-Turns in the road
- Please park on the school side of the road
- Please do not obstruct any driveways.

If the wooden gates at the end of the lane fail to open it needs a little time to reset. Reverse back from the gate, wait a minute or two then drive forward. The gates should open. If the gates still fail to open, please do not force them open as this damages the underground opening mechanism which is very expensive to replace. You will need to turn around and enter/ exit the lane from the other end. However, the gate is set on a timer to be open at busy school times so this should not be an issue.

A reminder regarding the end of the day pick-ups:

At the end of the day when collecting pupils from the buses at the Girls' School site, parents must **park in the lane** and wait for their son in the gravel semi-circle. At these times there are a lot of children that we are trying to get to parents safely. There are now an increasing number of parents driving in and trying to park or doing multiple circuits in and around the driveway. This compromises the safety of all of our pupils. The driveway is only to be used if you need to turn around so that you do not turn in the Lane.

The safety of our pupils is paramount and therefore we need everyone to abide by the rules, without exception.
