A Message from Mrs McShane



One of the things that I value so much about the pupils at Cumnor Girls is their ability to talk. As you know, we have placed a great emphasis on oracy at the school, actively encouraging the girls to express their thoughts, ideas and feelings. The girls have opportunities to discuss in lessons, assemblies, breaktimes and staff sit with the girls and chat with them at lunchtimes. This begins in Reception and carries on all the way through. The effect of this is two-fold: firstly, the girls are very confident when speaking to any adult in the school, this can be general chatter about their day, what they are doing for birthdays, seeing family etc or, it can be that they need to express a concern or a worry. Whatever the subject, I know that the girls feel able to talk to any member of staff, this not only helps the girls to grow as communicators but also ensures that we maintain our strong sense of being a safe community. The second benefit to our culture of oracy is that because the girls are enabled to bounce ideas around, encouraged to share their opinions and to justify them, they are more able to write them down; because in speech they are less hindered to use creative vocabulary they are more likely to write it. Speech comes before writing and varied speech leads to better writing – in all subjects. I am proud of the way our girls present themselves whether they are in Reception or in Year Six and we will continue to build on this as a key part of our teaching and learning. This is, after all, not just something for their primary years, or their senior school years, it is a life skill.

I am pleased to say that the new coat in lost property has been claimed. The larger sized coats that have been on order from Perrys are due to be delivered very soon. If you have not got a school coat for your

daughter, please order one as soon as possible. Too many girls are wearing a random assortment of coats.


Thank you for responding positively to the messaging about morning drop-off of children and also the afternoon collections. It makes such a difference when everybody does the right thing.

We will soon be launching the parents' evening appointments. We have made the decision to keep these on-line, although the guidance on events is beginning to relax, I am still reluctant to have too many people mingling in close proximity. The priority must remain on keeping our whole community safe. We have listened to and taken note of feedback from parents and extended the form teacher time from 10 to 15 minutes which should make the meeting feel less rushed and negate the need for a follow up meeting. There will also be opportunity for Years 3, 4 and 5 to make appointments to speak with specialist staff as parents in Years 4 and 5 in particular, may wish to discuss senior school scholarship potential. Due to possible numbers, these meetings will be 5 minutes long. Please be prompt to any scheduled meetings as the platform is quite brutal and will cut off at the end of the scheduled time.

The survey will remain open until 21st February 2022.


New White Rose App for Key Stage 1

You may be aware that at Cumnor Girls we follow the White Rose curriculum for our Maths lessons. This week, White Rose have introduced a new app called '1-Minute Maths'. This first version of the app is aimed at Key Stage 1 pupils. Individual one-minute tasks will focus on adding and subtracting – and on 'Subitising', the skill of instantly recognising the number of items in a group without counting. Multiplication and division will be added soon!

Your daughter can choose any topic they want to try. They then answer a unique series of questions (so it's a different set of questions every time). If they're struggling with a question, a 'Hint' button will give

a helpful clue by showing the question in a different but familiar way. When the one minute's up, they'll see a feedback screen telling them how they've done.

This app is completely optional for parents to download onto a tablet or device of their choice. This is not a new platform for school and will only be used at home.



Next Thing Education - Tech Camp

Over the February half term we are delighted to offer another activity for pupils of Cumnor House school aged between 5 and 11. Next Thing Education will be running a week long tech course where children will cover all manner of things to do with coding, movie making, app design etc. All activities that will give pupils a greater knowledge and understanding of technical and logical skills.
