Mathematics

Record numbers accurately, thinking about tens and ones. Add and subtract by counting forwards and backwards. Simple problem solving, including sharing.

Capacity and weighing.

Count in 10s.





<u>Literacy</u>

Continue to build recognition of set 3 phonic sounds.

Blend sounds to read and write words and sentences.

Record events that take place.

Link capital letters to their lowercase letters.

Learn red words and simple spelling rules.

Write in a variety of ways – recount, stories, letters, invitations, lists, notes, labels.

Include capital letters and finger spaces in all pieces of writing.

Topic

Celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee and the lives of people around them.

Plant a variety of seeds, plants and vegetables and observe and record the changes that occur as they grow.

Describe their environment using maps.

Attend a trip to a farm to observe animals and their lifecycles.

Changing routine

Continue to re-enforce pool rules and procedures

Ballet

Developing the children's basic motor skills including skipping, galloping and running through the use of songs, props and imaginative dance exercises.

Ways in which you can help your daughter:

- Read regularly with your child allowing them to use their phonic knowledge to read the story, whilst also describing the story, making predictions and making up new endings.
- Encourage your daughter to write sentences about the books they read, or activities and events they take part
- Regular practice of coin recognition. Allow your daughter to help you to count out your coins in shops or check vour change.
- Help her to recognise numbers from 0 100.
- ✓ Encourage addition and subtraction of small numbers.
- ✓ Practice forming numbers correctly.
- ✓ Encourage her to manage her own needs independently.
- ✓ Encourage cutting skills using scissors.
- ✓ Encourage neat presentation of ALL homework, including pictures.
