Dear Parents

As we look forward to welcoming your child to the Main School, we wanted to remind you that, on transition to the Main School, fees will be billed on a termly basis and, in line with the Parent Contract, fees will be payable on or before the first day of term. If you wish to pay monthly, you will need to make payment via School Fee Plan, as this is the only monthly option available to parents. After School Care - Collection after 6pm

After School Club at every site closes at 6pm. Therefore, a charge of £20 per 15 minutes after 6pm will be incurred by any parents who have not collected their child/children by 6pm. This includes late pick up from South Croydon Nursery.

Late/No booking charges

The charge for late/no booking for After School Care will increase to £7.50 per hour from Autumn Term 2022.

Bulk purchase for wraparound care

From Autumn Term 2022, all wraparound care offers (purchasing wraparound care for the full term) will carry a 10% discount. Previously this discount has only been available for 4 or 5 days a week.

CCV Payments

CCV payments can take up to 10 working days to process, so please ensure payments are made in advance to guarantee the money is in your purse in time to book wraparound care. From Autumn Term

2022, if there is not sufficient money in your purse to purchase wraparound care, you will need to make payment by an alternative means or pay the no booking fee of £7.50.

On Monday the children celebrated the **Queens Jubilee** with the children wearing red, white and blue and joined Pre-School and Reception in the hall for a **lovely picnic.** The children also loved playing with the castle and having their pictures taken as soldiers in front of Buckingham Palace. The Reception boys have started their new topic for the half term **'Engineers'.** They have enjoyed exploring the new role play area and have been busy building and designing different structures. The boys independently sourced their materials and tested their bridge. The boys showed great resilience as many had to go back and change their designs, sometimes up the three times before their bridge successfully carried the goats across to the other side safely.
