On Wednesday, the eight Year 6 finalists took part in their Bake-off challenge, in this they use a variety of the skills that they have accumulated over the years with a mystery bake, they are assessed on their technique, the finished product, the way they work together and how they tidy up afterwards. By the time you read this the girls will have had a day of activities, some over at the Boys' site with their contemporaries and others back at the Girls' site whilst the boys had matches. Looking ahead



Notices from Finance.....

After School Care

Collection after 6pm

After School Club at every site closes at 6pm. Therefore, a charge of £20 per 15 minutes after 6pm will be incurred by any parents who have not collected their child/children by 6pm. This includes late pick up from South Croydon Nursery.

Late/No booking charges

The charge for late/no booking for After School Care will increase to £7.50 per hour from Autumn Term 2022.

Bulk purchase for wraparound care

From Autumn Term 2022, all wraparound care offers (purchasing wraparound care for the full term) will carry a 10% discount. Previously this discount has only been available for 4 or 5 days a week.

CCV Payments

CCV payments can take up to 10 working days to process, so please ensure payments are made in advance to guarantee the money is in your purse in time to book wraparound care. From Autumn Term 2022, if there is not sufficient money in your purse to purchase wraparound care, you will need to make payment by an alternative means or pay the no booking fee of £7.50

We are delighted to inform you that Cumnor Girls and Cumnor Boys will be coming together for an exciting team building day. This will take place for all pupils in Reception-Year 6 on **Monday 13th June**. This ties into a wider focus on preventing sexual harassment in schools as championed by Ofsted. We plan that this team building day will be an opportunity for all our pupils to work together to achieve great outcomes.




This week at the Girls' School.....



Year 4 Multiplication Tables Check

In the last week of term, Year 4 took part in the TT Rockstars 'Officially Unofficial MTC'. The girls were tested on their timestables knowledge and their results were then compared to those of other schools in Croydon and nationally. As expected, our girls performed brilliantly, with our average score being 21/25 and 31% of them gaining full marks. Both of these scores were well above the average of Croydon and the rest of the nation. Well done, Year 4, on such a great achievement!



ISA South London Athletics Tournament

On Tuesday, 18 athletes from Years 3-6 took part in the ISA South London Athletics Tournament against 15 other schools. They all ran, threw and jumped their hearts out in not the best conditions and all gained valuable experience in the process. Performances to note were Tien (Year 6) and Arielle (Year 5) who both finished 4th in their respective 600m races narrowly missing out on the top 2 who qualify for the national finals. Afua (Year 6) was only 80cms away from the qualification as well in the Shot Putt, considering she had only picked it up for the first time while away on the residential before half term, she should be incredibly pleased with her efforts! Daisy (Year 3) jumped a huge 3m 45cm in the Year 4 Long Jump to finish in second place which is superb, unfortunately, in the field events only the winner qualifies for the nationals but as Daisy is a year young the future is bright indeed. Well done, girls!



Year 6 Cricket

On Wednesday, the Year 6 girls travelled to Hawthorns School for their A-C cricket matches and came away with a clean sweep! The C Team won 268-251 with player of the match going to Averie, the B Team won 264-227 with Sumayya being awarded the batter of the match and Tien the bowler of the match and the A Team won 236-198 with Daisy being awarded player of the match. All the

girls performed brilliantly and were a credit to themselves and the school, not only in how they played but in their behaviour as well.



Free Maths Webinar Sessions

'Parallel', a charitable mathematics project founded and run by bestselling science author and maths educator, Simon Singh, are launching free online maths circles for **students aged 9-11** every week.

The first circle is on **Monday June 13 at 5pm** (students take part from home), and then they continue every Monday through the summer and throughout the next academic year. The circles are a way for students to learn from some of the best maths educators in the world. They will contain a mix of challenging questions, puzzles and enrichment topics.

The circles are completely safe and secure - students do not appear on screen and cannot be heard, and only the educators can see chat comments.

How to sign up

- Parents can create their own accounts for their children by visiting **parallel.org.uk** they can sign up for free using a parent email address.
- There is no need to register for any particular maths circle or information session. Just visit **parallel.org.uk/circles** at the right time on the right day.
