On Thursday, Year 6 ventured to their **Junior Citizen** afternoon. During their time at Junior Citizen each girl experienced a safety scenario where they are taught a variety of skills and suggested ways to safely deal with a situation which could arise during daily life. The aim of each safety scenario is to allow children the opportunity of recognising and dealing with danger in a realistic way and one which they will remember, should they need to cope with a situation in real life.

It was wonderful to welcome so many families into school on Wednesday for our **"Look at Learning"**, this has become such an established part of what we do now, encouraging you to have really positive conversations with your daughters and for them to speak confidently about their learning. Such a valuable experience all round. First Aid Training


