# A Message from Mrs McShane

Dear Parents/Carers,

The girls are in full swing with their **learning** now and I have seen some lovely things as I have been walking around school. Confident artwork, great problem-solving in Maths, some superb writing, and beautiful singing – just to name a few things that go on a day-to-day basis. We have welcomed a couple of girls who have visited for taster days and your daughters have made everyone feel like they are part of the family.

Year 6 went to the **Junior Citizen** training on Thursday afternoon, the aim of this is to give children the skills that they would need to deal with a range of emergency situations. It provides a hands-on approach to situations children may encounter in their transition to secondary school and beyond.

A group of our elite runners went, today, to **Epsom College** for a **Cross Country** tournament. All girls did well, each working hard and striving to be their best self. Special congratulations to Sienna who, in a field of 180 runners, came first in the 3k course, completing it in 11:42 minutes! 
## **Year 3 Science**
