A Focus on History...

















































This week Reception have been very busy learning about two Celebrations; **Diwali** and **Remembrance Day!**













For Diwali we looked at the story 'Binny's Diwali' which explores all the different ways in which Hindu's and Sikh's celebrate. We designed henna patterns, used Numicon pieces to make a Rangoli pattern and then worked together as a class to create our own by using bold, bright coloured tissue paper and shapes!

For Remembrance Day, we looked at the fallen soldiers from the past that helped shape our lives today. We also thought about the animals that were also impacted by the Wars from the past. During Art this week, we created our own poppy flowers, which we then took to our local monument on Friday to pay our respects.

This week in maths we have been using our knowledge of numbers to 10 to support us on counting back. We noticed that the numbers started 'big' and have ended 'smaller' the closer we got to 0!
