Dear Parents



Year 6 Citizenship Scheme Trip

On Tuesday **Year 6 visited Croydon Fire Station for a Citizenship Scheme Trip**, pictured at the top of this week's newsletter. **Daniy T-L (6T)** has kindly provided the following write up of his experience:

'On Tuesday, Year 6 attended a session at Croydon Fire Station about different essentials life skills, like how to identify a safe stranger using ID, what to do when in a fire and knowing the difference between good and bad drugs. With multiple helpers from the police, the fire department and the ambulance, Year 6 had an exciting and wonderous trip and I am here to explain the details.

Firstly, after a brief introduction, we learnt about our first topic, knife crime. Unfortunately, children in year 7 are mostly affected by this, being the ones to rob stores and steal things most often due to wanting to fit in with friend groups. We were told it is mostly something where a person maybe at school could make a friend with someone, and they ask you to hold a prohibited item. Then, the next day, they can blackmail you and make you keep on doing it for them. A way to stop this is by telling a teacher. We then headed into the next room for another lesson.

Our next lesson was on ID identification or 'Stranger Danger'. We were firstly taught about how to identify someone using the three main parts of their ID. Their name, occupation and a picture of them. Then, the person teaching us left and someone came in. They said they were going to take a photo of us and take us in a fire truck. Before anyone fell for it, Oliver shouted 'ID!' and everyone realised he was fake. Then we learnt about travel. We learnt about how to measure where to

stand, how to use oyster cards and what to do when someone or something falls onto train tracks. My highlight was when we simulated entering a bus and Toprak made the goofiest grumpy face because no one said hello to him!

We then learnt about fire safety. We learnt about what to do in a fire and the effects of a fire when not extinguished. We also learnt about fire hazards and luckily, the fire department has a smoke detector for every household for free! Then, we learnt about what to do when you see someone on the street. You follow this procedure called DR ABC with stands for danger, response, airways, breathing and Call 999. Finally, we learnt about drugs. We learnt about the good and the bad and what to do when you see someone with drugs. It was then the end. We took a photo in front of the travel area and left, making sure to greet the bus driver. I am glad that our school signed us up for this scheme because it really taught us a lot about how to be a good and aware citizen'.

Reception have been very busy diving into their new topic, **'Stories from around the World'.** The boys will be immersed in a variety of cultures and traditions through stories told in different parts of the globe.

This week we have been transported 'down under' all the way to Australia through the story 'Wombat Stew'. The boys have enjoyed learning about animals that originate from Australia, some of which they had not heard of before, like an echidna and a kookaburra.

The boys put their creative skills to the test by creating their own 'Dot Painting' inspired by the Indigenous people of Australia, a traditional piece of art created through dots in bright colours, patterns and shapes.

In **Maths** this week, we have begun to look at **teen numbers.** We looked at their place value by exploring each numbers composition by using a variety of objects. We have used language such as 'tens' and 'ones' to explain our findings.




























Pre-School

The most exciting activity part of the week has been making 'Wolf' soup. We added the ingredients of sweet potatoes and carrots into a soup maker and by the afternoon the soup was ready. We all tried the soup with a little bit of bread, all the children were very excited!
