Swimming



We have had a very busy week of swimming with both the **London League Final** and the heats of the **National IAPS** held over the past few days. We have also received the results of the **Croydon Schools heats** which were held the previous week. Our boys were very dominant in all of these events and put in great performances. Please see below the report for each competition.

London League Final

Having qualified first against the 23 schools who competed in the first round, we had high hopes that we would be able to defend our title from last year. The boys didn't disappoint, and we put in a very dominant display and ran out convincing winners against the 5 other schools who had made it through to the final.

Our strength in depth really shone through especially in the relay events where we won every relay in Year 3, 4 and 5 and won 11 of the 15 relays in total. A special mention to the three Year 5 boys who swam up an age group and competed for the Year 6 team.

We will now go on to compete in the Grand Final along with the second and third schools in our gala and the top three schools from north of the river final. Please see below the full result.

National IAPS heats

We hosted one of the preliminary rounds of this year's **National IAPS competition** at **Whitgift School**. There are heats held all over the country and over 6000 swimmers compete. Our swimmers swam exceptionally well, and we look forwards to receiving the overall results where the tops 20 swimmers in each event will qualify to compete in the National finals which are held at the London Aquatic Centre in June.

A special mention must be given to our **Year 5** boys, who are an extremely impressive team. **We have been Year 5 National Champions for the past two years and the times that these boys swam yesterday were significantly faster than the times that our boys achieved in the qualifying round over the past two years.** I have very high hopes that this team is capable of breaking the longstanding National relay record at the Finals. There is a lot of competition for places in this team with at least 7 boys looking to be selected for one of the 4 places in this team.

I would like to say a massive 'Thank you' to Whitgift for not only letting us use their pool to host this event, but also providing us with their staff to make sure that the event ran so smoothly.

Croydon Schools

We were once again very dominant in the qualifying round of this competition. We finished first and second in every Year 4 & 5 race except one where we were first and third! It would be a great achievement to finish first and second in every one of these races in the finals. The Year 6 boys also swam exceptionally well. They are fastest qualifiers in both relays events and have qualified in medal positions in all their events. The **Finals** will be held at Trinity School on **Wednesday 21st February**.

Keep up the great work in preparation for these upcoming Finals!

Pathway to Pre-School

Some of you may be aware that we have opened a new classroom at Purley. We have seen increasing demand at our Purley site and we want to ensure the quality of education continues. This classroom will be called **Pathway to Pre -School (P2P)**. It will be for children that are ready for their next steps in learning and are moving up to Pre-School in September 2024. If we feel your child is ready based

on our observations and assessments you will have received a letter. If you feel your child could be ready, please feel free to reach out to us via email or on the gate in the morning after half term.

Additional Days

We are getting very busy in the nursery classes, which is normal for this time of year. If you are considering increasing your child's days, as they move towards Pre-School or Reception, please ensure you give us at least a month's notice as we are now starting to fill up on some days. If you are considering increasing days in the summer term it is important you let us know now and secure that place to avoid disappointment.

Reception

This week in Reception, the boys have been thinking a lot about their own mental health for 'Children's Mental Health Week'. We read 'Ruby's Worry', wrote our own worries on a worry monster and thought about how we can deal with our worries. We also spoke about the importance of asking for help and how speaking to someone we trust can help us to feel better.

On Tuesday it was 'Safer Internet Day'. We discussed ways to stay safe online and what we should do if we feel unsure anything we come across on the internet. The boys had lots of thoughtful ideas on how to protect themselves, keeping their personal information safe and who can help them.

We have continued with our Lunar New Year festivities, taking part in lots of fun activities related to this festival. The boys created their own dragons in recognition of 'The Year of the Dragon' and they had the privilege of watching the Year 8 pupils perform a dragon dance to them. RL performed a brilliant assembly about 'The Great Race', thank you to everyone who came to watch them!

In Maths, we have enjoyed exploring capacity using different resources and liquids. We have asked lots of questions and tested our predictions. We experimented with containers of different shapes and sizes, liquids and solids and used spoons/cups and other equipment to measure with.
