CHS U9A RUGBY – Milbourne Lodge School U9 Rugby Festival

The U9A team were invited to the Milbourne Lodge Rugby Tournament on Monday 4th March. The team were extremely excited to play some rugby as they hadn't played a fixture for over 5 weeks due to the weather conditions. Before the tournament started, Cumnor were seeded into a group with 3 other teams (Milbourne Lodge, CLFS and Surbiton High).

The team started off their tournament in emphatic style, winning 35-20 against the host side Milbourne Lodge. Henry O put in a man of the match performance with some textbook tackles to stop Milbourne Lodge crossing the game line. In our second match, we came up against Surbiton High. The team pieced together an excellent team performance by closing the space in defence allowing Cumnor to be on the front foot for most of the game. In attack, the boys executed their set moves with perfection, allowing Cumnor to be a constant threat in attack throughout the match. Final score 30 - 5 to Cumnor.

In our final we played CLFS. This was a very short match due to the opposition arriving late to the tournament. However, Cumnor came out on top winning the match 15-5.

Once all the group games had been completed, the tournament organisers arranged an extra fixture for all teams taking part in the tournament. We were placed against another Cognita school, Downsend. Cumnor started brightly against Downsend, taking a 15-5 lead at half time. The boys rallied up at half time, determined not to let their lead slip away. The second half of the game became very physical, with some excellent tackles from both sides on display but, Cumnor were clinical in attack which allowed us to extend our lead even further (final score 25- 10 to Cumnor). Due to RFU regulations, unfortunately no trophy could be awarded to any team, however, a medal for both player of the tournament and RFU code of conduct would be given to each participating

team. Henry O was awarded Cumnor's Player of the Tournament and Haris was awarded the RFU values award. I would like to personally congratulate all the boys that were involved.

Swimming

The top 20 swimmers in each event have qualified to compete in the National Finals to be held at the London Aquatic Centre on Saturday 8th June.

All of our Year 5 team have qualified for the finals. Our relay team qualified first, as has Sebastian in Backstroke. Ayden, Christian and Ammar have all qualified in the top 7 places for their respective events, which gives us a great chance of winning the top Year 5 school for the 3rd consecutive year. A special mention must go to Christian who has qualified 7th for the Individual Butterfly Final despite only being in Year 4.

Both of our Year 6 relay teams have qualified, and I have high hopes that they can improve on their seeding to push for a top 5 finish at the Finals. Archie had a great heat swim and has qualified for the Year 7 Breaststroke Final.

Let's increase the hard work in preparation for the finals!

They also thought about what they do at different times of the day from getting ready for school in the morning to eating their dinner in the evening. Billy Bears Busy week helped us talk about the days of the week and we sang songs to help us remember the order. We welcomed the first day of Spring. It is so lovely to see the bright weather. We will be spending lots of happy hours over the coming weeks enjoying the best classroom of all being outdoors together.












Pre-School South Croydon

This week in Pre-School we have been celebrating British Science week, This year's theme is 'time' so we have been making watches using different shapes and making sure we write the correct numbers on the face, alongside this throughout the week we have been looking at the weather and drawing the weather on our forms for each day to see if it changes over time. We had a great visit from Mrs Hibbert who talked to us about acid and alkaline liquids and the PH scale.

We have also been looking at the Australian animals and talking about the time difference between us and them, looking at which animals are dangerous and looking at a map to see how far away Australian is. For our board we have made a Kangaroo with different textured materials.

As the weather is improving, we will be spending more of the day outside and giving children the freedom to be independent with coats and jumpers. Please ensure all are labelled clearly with your child's name.

Pathway to Pre-School

This week in Pathway to Pre-school we have enjoyed learning about animals that originate from Australia. The children have had lots of fun creating their own boomerangs and koala pictures. We have loved learning a special Australian song with Pre-school.

The children have been taking part in lots of fun experiments during British Science Week. They particularly loved our floating and sinking experiment and were so engaged throughout. The children marked on their sheet what they predicted would happen and took it in turns to place an object in the water, predicting whether it would float or sink. Kindergarten

Kindergarten South Croydon

This week we have been looking at pond life. We have talked about the cycle of a tadpole to a frog and learnt lots of exciting words like frog spawn, tadpole, frog, toad and Lilly pad. The children have enjoyed making their own paper pond working on their cutting skills, learning to cut straight across the paper and then around photos the more confident they got.

We have had lots of fun in the '5 little speckled frogs' and 'duck pond' in the tuff tray playing with green rice and sticks, counting the frogs and ducks. We now look forward to a fun filled Easter break with lots of craft and baking activities to do!







Kindergarten Purley

This week we have been celebrating British Science Week. We started our week with a visit from Mrs Hibbert our Head of Science and she showed us some simple experiments on how mixing certain liquids together can alter their acid and alkaline content, making the liquids change colour.

We have also been working on three experiments of our own in class.

First was our salt painting pictures, using a salt water mixture the children painted their own pictures, we placed them on the drying rack and returned later in the day. We saw that the water had dried and the salt had become more vibrant revealing the children's pictures.

Our second experiment involved using felt tip pens and cotton wool. We coloured the cotton wool before placing the circles into water - the children were fascinated to watch the colours leave the cotton wool and float on the water.

The last experiment. Mrs Hollands personal favourite, was picking ice up with string! Everyone knows you cannot use string to pick up ice but pour salt over the string and ice and wait a short while and the salt helps attach the string to the ice so you can pick it up.
